Volunteer Updates

COVID-19 Updates and Policy

As you may know, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) issued an emergency temporary standard (ETS) requiring employers with 100 or more workers to require all employees be either fully vaccinated for COVID-19 or require unvaccinated workers to do weekly COVID-19 testing (produce negative results). We see COVID-19 vaccination/testing as important protective measures for carrying out our mission, while protecting our staff and the people we serve, and our communities. Because of this, Family Pathways is implementing a COVID-19 vaccination, testing, and face covering policy at this time for all volunteers.
