FOOD ACCESS AND EQUITY

Family Pathways provides access to healthy food for families and individuals in crisis through 9 Food Shelves, a mobile food pantry, weekend food (Backpack) program for youth, and Doorstep Delivery - a new program bringing food directly to housebound seniors.

AGING SERVICES

Aging Services helps older adults and their caregivers age well at home by providing homemaking services, caregiver support and consulting, and community education.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT SERVICES

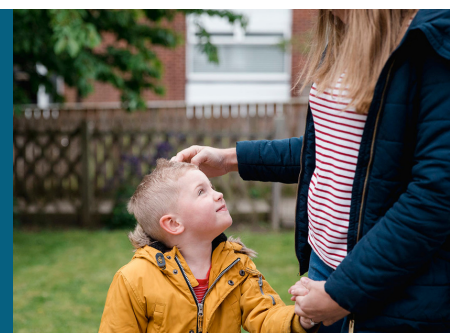
Through advocacy, emergency shelter and education we partner to promote violence-free lives and break the cycle of abuse. Our Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Services include the Black Dog Hill Emergency Shelter, a 24-hour crisis hotline, community advocacy, criminal justice advocacy, and intervention programs.

PARENTING TIME SERVICES

Family Pathways provides supervised & monitored parenting time to assure that children have safe contact with absent family members. This service is offered as a tool to assist families as they navigate difficult times and transitions.

"I was worried about everything and this is such a relief in so many ways - using your services is the best choice and I am so grateful they exist!"

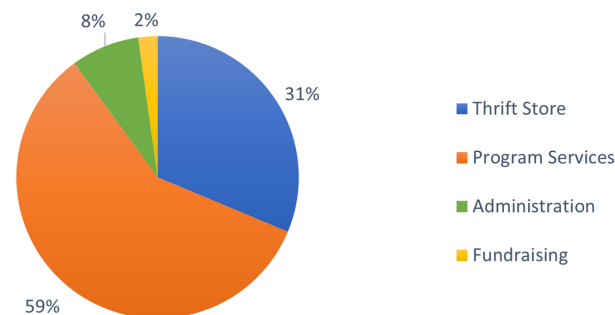

VOLUNTEER HOURS

Every day, Family Pathways provides volunteer opportunities that create positive change in East Central Minnesota and Western Wisconsin. We rely on our volunteers across all of our programs and we are so grateful for their dedication. Family Pathways volunteers come from all walks of life, backgrounds, service groups, businesses, youth groups, and educational systems. In 2021, 1011 volunteers served 58,117 hours in roles throughout our Family Pathways Programs, with their hours providing a total value of \$1,800,464.

DONORS

This year our donors contributed 2,217,740 pounds of food to our food shelves, over 2.4 million items to our Thrift Stores, and more than \$1.6 million to our programs. This has allowed us to support more than 20,000 of our neighbors in need over the past year.

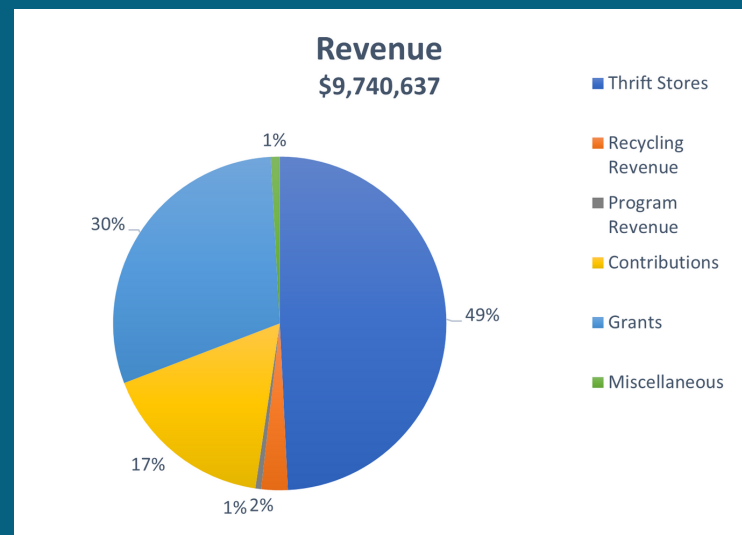
THRIFT STORES

More than a place to find a bargain, Family Pathways Thrift Stores transform donated goods into opportunity, investment, and good environmental stewardship. The profits from the Thrift Stores are invested directly back into the programs that serve our communities. 51% of our organization's funding comes from the revenue generated by our 10 Thrift Stores, eCommerce, and our metal and clothing recycling programs.

2021 Impact Report

Family Pathways works alongside people to enhance lives through a continuum of essential services and—together with community—champion positive social change.

MEALS

In 2021, Family Pathways distributed

1,916,687 meals - 10,103 of these meals were through mass food distribution events and 164,362 meals to 548 people through our Mobile Food Shelf. 748 children received the nutrition they needed from the 65,108 meals provided by our Backpack Program. Meals were also provided by our Doorstep Delivery program and the food shelves themselves.

FOUND SHELTER AND ADVOCACY

271 women and children found shelter at Black Dog Hill Emergency Shelter in 2021. Our community advocates supported 2,838 people in finding safety and self-sufficiency after domestic violence and sexual assault. Our advocates also made 66,154 follow up calls to people seeking help.

AWARDED TO INAUGURAL FAMILY PATHWAYS SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

Four students were chosen as the inaugural recipients of the Family Pathways Scholarship. Established in 2020, this scholarship seeks to amplify the voices of Black students in our communities through the possibilities of education. The scholarship was created at the request of donors inspired by events in 2020 and is funded solely by designated donations.

OLDER ADULTS AND CAREGIVERS



Aging Services staff and volunteers provided support to 163 caregivers, homemaking services to 227 older adults, doorstep delivery to 149 individuals, and education and outreach to 421 people in our community.

SUPERVISED VISITS

Family Pathways Parenting Time Services provided 2,702 hours of supervision to 137 families across 14 counties, allowing parents and children to stay connected.

MILLION POUNDS SAVED FROM LANDFILL

Family Pathways Thrift Stores received donations from 93,863 people in 2021. Thrift Store customers donated an additional \$155,895 to support programming by rounding up their purchases.
