Events:

• Our volunteers completed service day events that were held at our shelter, stores, and food shelves. Some of these events were remote events. For example, we had groups help make quilts, birthday bags, and kindness cards. Group events combined included 549 individuals who provided 2,000 hours of service to Family Pathways. Many of the organizations also helped support our campaigns and programs.
