Funding Impact

FOOD ACCESS AND EQUITY

Family Pathways provides access to healthy food for families and individuals in crisis through 9 Food Shelves, a mobile food pantry, weekend food (Backpack) program for youth, and Doorstep Delivery - a program bringing food directly to housebound seniors.

"Times are very hard for my children and I right now, we are struggling like many people out there. Not having money for groceries is a scary thing when you have hungry kids to feed and I was going without some meals to make sure there was enough for them. Thanks to Family Pathways we don't have to worry about missing any meals now, thank you for that peace of mind"

AGING SERVICES

Aging Services helps older adults and their caregivers age well at home by providing homemaking services, caregiver support and consulting, and community education.

"I am so relieved that my mom and dad will be getting services as I was the only one left who could help," said a client's daughter who had been driving a long distance weekly to help her parents.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT SERVICES

Through advocacy, emergency shelter, and education, we partner to promote violence-free lives and break the cycle of abuse. Our Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Services include the Black Dog Hill Emergency Shelter, a 24-hour crisis hotline, community advocacy, criminal justice advocacy, and intervention programs.

PARENTING TIME SERVICES





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

MEALS

FOUND SHELTER AND ADVOCACY

In 2022, Family
Pathways distributed 1,831,592 meals These meals were through mass food
distribution events. 171,210 meals to 457
people through our Mobile Food Shelf. 854
children received the nutrition they needed
from 83,288 meals provided by our Backpack
Program. Meals were also provided by our
Doorstep Delivery program and the food
shelves themselves.

479 Adults and children found shelter at Black Dog Hill Emergency Shelter in 2022. Our community advocates supported 2664 people in finding safety and self-sufficiency after domestic violence and sexual assault. Our advocates also made 21,643 follow up calls to people seeking help.



FAMILY PATHWAYS SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

One student was chosen as the recipient of the Family Pathways Scholarship in 2022. Established in 2020, this scholarship seeks to amplify the voices of Black students in our communities through the possibilities of education. The scholarship was created at the request of donors inspired by events in 2020 and is funded solely by designated donations.

OLDER ADULTS AND CAREGIVERS



Aging Services staff and volunteers provided 1,118 hours of support to 103 caregivers, homemaking services to 135 older adults, doorstep delivery to 88 individuals, and education and outreach to 296 people in our community.

SUPERVISED VISIT HOURS

Family Pathways Thrift Stores received donations from 92,800 people in 2022. Thrift Store customers donated an additional \$129,033 to support programming by rounding up their purchases.

Family Pathways Parenting Time Services provided 2640 hours of supervision to families across the counties we serve allowing parents and children to stay connected.

The goal is to amplify voices of Black students in our community through access to higher education by bridging the financial gap many of them face.
